This left the Exec rink who were behind and Mike Parsons (who had stepped in to fill Garry's place last minute) the last to finish. We needed 1 pt from the two.

The Exec rink sadly faded late on and with it their chance of their own league. Mike was last to finish and at 18 ends thanks to a 4 was 20-12 up. However, a loose 19th end saw them drop a 4 making us all somewhat nervous. End 20 and a couple down saw Mike draw 2 outstanding shots to give a 6 shot lead going into the last. With no heroics and plenty of bowls in the head and cover, we were happy to drop a 2 and secure the points needed.

5 Games played, 30 individual rinks and we won by 1 pt overall.
